a. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Whereas Black people are a historically marginalized group. Whereas BUSU currently has a space for Indigenous students per the Indigenous collective and representative, and for other people of color per the Racialized collective and representative; out of the BIPOC community, black students currently do not have a separate space and whereas Black students at BU have made requests to BUSU for a black students association, BUSU is proposing a Constitutional amendment to add a Black Students' representative to the Board of Directors.

Whereas BU Bobcat athletes are a separate group of students on campus with peculiar needs, who in recent years have been underrepresented and not adequately advocated for by other systems within BU and, in recent times, the concerns of student athletes have not been properly addressed by the University, BUSU is proposing a Constitutional amendment to add a Student Athlete representative to the BUSU Board of Directors.
